NERAC established three Regional Cache Sites located in Beverly, Framingham, and Lexington to provide the region's municipalities with critical emergency response equipment for necessary to restore infrastructure and care for their citizens during emergencies. Over \$1.7 million has been invested into this system to provide large resources that cannot be justifiably purchased and maintained by individual municipalities.

Cache Fee System

- In an effort to ensure that cache equipment is well taken care of and remains useful for as long as possible, NERAC has established a nominal daily fee for the use of equipment.
- This fee is calculated as 0.1% of the original purchase price of the equipment (per day). These fees are collected by the cache site hosts and kept in segregated accounts to be used for the following:
 - > Equipment inspections
- > Routine repairs from normal wear and tear of equipment > Routine maintenance
